BADAC voluntary redundancies

I want to clear up some rumours and misconceptions currently circulating in the community. BADAC is currently running a voluntary redundancy process among our 237 staff. This is part of being a large, high-functioning organisation.

BADAC is a strong operator, with advanced HR, Governance, and Finance teams and processes. We have long-term, talented executives and staff who bring considerable expertise to their jobs. BADAC remains in a strong financial position with an impressive asset base, which continues to grow.

The voluntary redundancy process enables BADAC to exercise mindful economy and make significant savings. This is also a terrific opportunity for our valued staff to choose a move to retirement or new careers. We are known for being both reliable and innovative. The redundancy program assists BADAC to ensure we have the right staff for the right jobs, now and into the future.

Please don't feel unsettled, this is a large ACCO ensuring we can evolve with the needs of our Aboriginal community, so we will continue to provide culturally safe, quality services to you all.

Funding news!

New Funding for Crisis and Transitional Housing for Aboriginal women

In February, government announced significant funding for BADAC: the federal government is funding us to build culturally safe housing for Aboriginal women and children needing crisis and transitional housing.

This is a much-needed and vital project for our community. We are absolutely delighted and look forward to delivering this project over the next few years.

New funding for playground at Perridak Burron

Thanks to the Victorian government Building Blocks program, Perridak Burron will have a new culturally rich play space in the 'babies' play area. We have been seeking funding for this playground for a few years, so the whole team is overjoyed to receive this great news.

Main Rd Planning for the future

BADAC was lucky to receive a Planning grant from Aboriginal Community Infrastructure Program in 2024. This has enabled us to contract an architect and explore three options to improve the current buildings for better community experience. This is a longer-term project, with the next steps to apply for funding to deliver the new vision for the site.

Visit by Westpac Board

BADAC was honoured to host a visit from the Westpac Board on Thursday 6 Feb. The event started with a smoking ceremony at our Wada Warr Borrela Elders Village, followed by a presentation in the Tree Room and a visit to Perridak Arts. The Board were happy to praise BADAC, saying we do "really good work in the community."

Progress on exciting BADAC Projects

BADAC continues to deliver on important community projects which are close to the hearts of BADAC and our Aboriginal community. These projects help to drive Aboriginal health and self-determination in our region.

Highlights include:

- Perridak Arts, our new Aboriginal Art gallery is thriving. Two local artists, Adrian Rigney and Donna Blackall, exhibited artworks in the Victorian First Peoples Art and Design Fair Showcase 2025 which was held at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre, 20 to 23 February. From all reports it was a great success!
- Five residents have moved in to Wada Warr Borrela Elders Village.
- Preparing for NAIDOC 2025

<u>Perridak Arts – a thriving art community, authentic local</u> <u>Aboriginal Art</u>

Perridak Arts is thriving. Huge thanks to everyone who is supporting our artists by buying art and craft items from Perridak Arts. Feel free also to simply visit and immerse yourself in a refreshing, warm, colourful, cultural space. We opened in April 2023 and I am thrilled to tell you that we have already returned \$130,000+ back to our Aboriginal community artists.

We currently have 74 Aboriginal artists on our books. If you are Aboriginal and would like to exhibit and sell painting, weaving, or other cultural arts, please do drop into the gallery and talk to our staff. New, experimenting, and established artists are all welcome.

Wada Warr Borrela Elders Village – delivering on the vision




