Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, Elders, babies, people with health issues are all extra vulnerable—the best way to keep our community safe is for all of us to have our vaccinations. BADAC medical clinic offers free flu and Covid vaccinations, please ring the clinic to make an appointment or for more information.

ANNOUNCEMENTS & OPENINGS IN 2023

This 31 March, Minister Harriet Shing formally turned the first sod to commence construction on our Elders Independent Living Village, a project I know is dear to the hearts of many of us.



On 17 April we had the Big Cheque presentation from Central Highlands Water to benefit our youth, to enable them to enjoy fantastic 'on Country' activities which our families and out-of-home carers generally can't afford. Activities might include 'swim with dolphins' and 'wildlife wonders' with the Otways Conservation Ecology Centre.



On Friday 28 April, we had the formal opening of Perridak Arts on Mair St, Ballarat. Congratulations to our many Aboriginal artists who are exhibiting their stunning artworks. Huge thanks to everyone—both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal—who are supporting our Aboriginal artists by buying craft items and art. Visitors are very welcome to just browse, if you don't have capacity to buy; the gallery is a rich, welcoming, warm and colourful cultural space.

ADVOCACY

Currently I am Chairperson of the Victorian Aboriginal Children and Young People's Alliance (VACYPA). Earlier this year we met with the Victorian Premier and outlined our most urgent concerns. He invited us to put a submission together which details Aboriginalled solutions, which members of the Alliance have done. I will keep you posted as things progress.

The Aboriginal community, via the Alliance, continues to lead the way for Aboriginal Children in Out of Home Care. We know that community control is vital to improve the lives of Aboriginal children and families.

VOICE TO PARLIAMENT

I want to encourage everybody to enrol to vote, if you are not already enrolled. If you are already enrolled to vote in elections, you do not need to enrol again for the referendum.

You must be enrolled to vote in order to have your say in the referendum.

This is Aboriginal people's first opportunity to be recognised in the constitution. Being recognised in the constitution and having that Voice to Parliament is going to be really important to progress Aboriginal health and towards true self-determination.

The Voice to Parliament proposal arose from The Uluru Statement from the Heart:

"The Uluru Statement from the Heart is an invitation to the Australian people. We ask Australians to accept our invitation to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future. We call for the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution and a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement-making and truth-telling about our history."

The key takeaways for Improving and increasing access to services through cultural safety are -

- 1. Improvements in cultural safety and self-determination can lead to better access and quality of health care.
- 2. Cultural safety / responsiveness is everyone's responsibility.
- 3. Advocate for mob and work towards better health outcomes.

The benefits of the flu vaccination are:


- It is a safe and effective way to protect you from serious disease caused by influenza.






Mother's Day afternoon Tea

Perridak Burron held their 2nd Morning tea for culture on the 2nd May 2023.





NEW PROGRAM AT BADAC

Culture Care Connect is a new program to the Social and Emotional Wellbeing service here at BADAC. The program is an aftercare service co designed by our Network coordinator April Burgoyne who has worked with community here at BADAC for over 12 years, and Korriene Lennecke who was the successful applicant to become the aftercare worker and has supported community in the SEWB department for four years.

April and SEWB manager Peter traveled to Sydney in March to an Onboarding Coordinator conference to help develop

the program.



Korriene and Peter will be travelling to Canberra late June to ensure the aftercare model is being delivered to community in a culturally safe manner.

April has completed both the Aftercare model and the Network suicide prevention plan. Both April & Korriene have been very busy attending training in suicide prevention including Safe Talk and Assist training, and also attending a board meeting. The Culture care connect team intend on providing training to staff and community in the near future.

The Culture care connect team recently attended an Indigenous Suicide Prevention forum in Brisbane to help with

networking and gain connections.



Over the three days we seen over 90 community members come through the camp—the biggest camp we have ever held!

We couldn't be more thankful to Central Highlands water on the generous donation to our youth programs, it was awesome for the kids to be a part of the celebration and being able to meet the staff from Central Highlands water.



We made contact with BADAC teams who work alongside kids in care so it could be a natural meeting between kids who were already engaged with the youth programs.

It was great to watch friendships being made in the short amount of time on camp.

The kids were able to be gently pushed out of their comfort zone by flying in the air on the giant swing, or hoisted up by their friends on the Possum glider.

We ran cultural activities over the three days including community members. Uncle Paul took the carers on bush walks, Uncle Al telling all of us dream time stories, Zane and Darren teaching the kids boomerang throwing & the dance group teaching other kids the dances and having them join in around the fire.

It was an amazing experience to watch kids be able to learn their culture all together and share their knowledge. We can't wait for the next one!






Charlotte recently received the school award for the BREAZE writing competition about World Environment Day. Well done!

Membership is a great way to connect with BADAC's services and your community.


Applications are sent to the Board who make all decisions about approving new members.



In partnership with Community, Fed Uni and the many stall holders who will be attending, we seek to empower and build self-determination, promoting the rights, needs and aspirations of future generations.




